RPA IAS Cancer Survivorship Research Scholarship Guidelines

Terms and Conditions

Background

The Institute of Academic Surgery (IAS) is providing a 12-month RPA Cancer Survivorship Scholarship opportunity for a student who is currently enrolled or has received an unconditional offer for admission in a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) at the University of Sydney. This new Scholarship aims to support individuals undertake research in cancer survivorship following treatment of bowel cancer, as well as develop and strengthen their research careers.

The 12-month Scholarship will provide funding support of \$36,000 to undertake research in their first and/or second year of study.

The successful applicant must abide by the Scholarship guidelines and will be required to sign an agreement. This will include such requirements as enrolment or an unconditional offer into a PhD at the University of Sydney, submission of progress reports at 6 and 12 months and the acknowledgement of the funding support provided by Sydney Local Health District (SLHD) in any publications and/or presentations relating to the research project funded through this Scholarship.

Eligibility

To be eligible for this Scholarship, you must:

- Be currently enrolled or have received an unconditional offer for admission to a PhD research degree at the University of Sydney;
- Have a research proposal related to the assessment of challenges, barriers and unmet needs in the management of bowel cancer;
- Have the support of a research supervisor who is a member of Royal Prince Alfred Hospital and will guarantee to provide supervision and guidance for the duration of the Scholarship. The research supervisor will need to provide a letter of support as part of the application.

Application

- The application must include:
 - A research proposal (using the application form below) outlining the title, project plan, anticipated outcomes, timeline, track record and research support;
 - \circ Full CV of the applicant;
 - Letter of support from the applicant's research supervisor;
 - Proof of enrolment in a PhD or if not yet enrolled in a HDR, proof of an unconditional offer.

Selection Criteria

- Applications will be peer-reviewed by an independent scientific panel from the RPA IAS.
- Applicants who are undertaking their first PhD degree will be prioritised when considering applications for the Scholarship.
- The Scholarship will be granted on the relevance and impact of the applicant's research proposal and research experience.
- The independent scientific panel will finalise the selection process.
- The assessment of the applications and decisions of the panel in awarding funds in this scheme will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.

Funding

- The Scholarship will run for 12 months for full-time students and 24 months for part-time students. A total of \$36,000 will be provided via stipends to the successful applicant, provided they meet the research requirements outlined below.
 - Full-time students will receive a total of \$36,000, paid in three equal instalments of \$12,000. The first payment will be made upon commencement of the Scholarship. The second and third payments will be made at 6 and 12 months providing the progress reports (template below) are assessed and deemed satisfactory by the Director IAS and the Primary Supervisor. Part-time students will be paid in three equal instalments of \$6,000 per year over a two-year period. The second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth payment will be made every 6 months for two years, providing the progress reports are assessed and deemed satisfactory by the Director IAS and the Primary Supervisor.
 - The stipend will be terminated should the Scholarship holder fail to maintain satisfactory academic progression, which will be determined by the Director IAS and Primary Supervisor.
 - The stipend payment will be made to each individual Scholarship holder into their nominated bank account.
 - The Scholarship is non-transferable to other areas of research.
 - Funds cannot be rolled over. No additional payments will be made.

Tenure

- The Scholarship shall be tenable for a period of 12-months (or 24-months for part-time students), commencing no later than 3 months from the date the award is announced.
- The applicant must have commenced their PhD activities no later than 3 months from the date the award is announced.
- Scholarship holders must promptly notify their academic supervisor and Director IAS of any changes to their enrolment including but not limited to attendance patterns, leave of absence, withdrawal and course transfer.
- A request to defer tenure of the Scholarship will only be considered subject to review by the IAS Executive Team.

Reporting Requirements

- Applicants must deliver the research project described in their application within the specified timeframe;
- Progress reports must be submitted to <u>SLHD-RPAIAS@health.nsw.gov.au</u> at 5 and 11 months (as well as 17 and 23 months for part-time students) using the template below. Each report will be assessed by the Director IAS and Primary Supervisor as either satisfactory or nonsatisfactory. Satisfactory reports will enable the stipend payment;
- SLHD must be acknowledged for the funding support provided in any publications and/or presentations relating to the research project.

Termination

The requirements of the scholarship will be terminated if:

- The student withdraws from their PhD;
- The IAS concludes the recipient has not carried out the development of their project with competence and diligence, fails to maintain satisfactory progress or has committed serious misconduct.
